2022 Bulk Trash Neighborhood Clean-up Application

Neighborhood clean-ups are community events sponsored by the Department of Neighborhoods and Citizen Engagement. The primary purpose of a neighborhood clean-up is for bulk trash cleanup.

****This program is only available for CBDG Eligible Areas within the City of Lansing. Please refer to the attached map for eligible locations. ****

The Department of Neighborhoods and Citizen Engagement is responsible for:

- Contracting a third-party waste management company who provides a dump truck, driver, and loading person for bulk trash items.

Neighborhood or civic organizations who are interested in facilitating a neighborhood cleanup in a CBDG eligible location (see map on back for map) are responsible for:

- Recruiting volunteers
- Promoting the event
- Having a person responsible for coordinating the event with the department

The neighborhood group or civic organization facilitating the event is responsible to coordinating volunteers to assist differently abled neighbors bring bulk trash items to the curb by 8am the designated day of the event. The same day of the event, volunteers are also responsible for cleaning-up litter from designated sidewalks, streets, and railroads. Organizations interested in a litter cleanup or brush cleanup event as opposed to a bulk trash cleanup should contact the Neighborhood Resource Coordinator (contact information on back).

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Guidelines for Neighborhood Cleanups

Bag, box or bundle loose trash-this is required
Items must be less than 4 feet long and bundled (especially lumber and pipe)

The following list may change at any time.

Examples of what we will take:

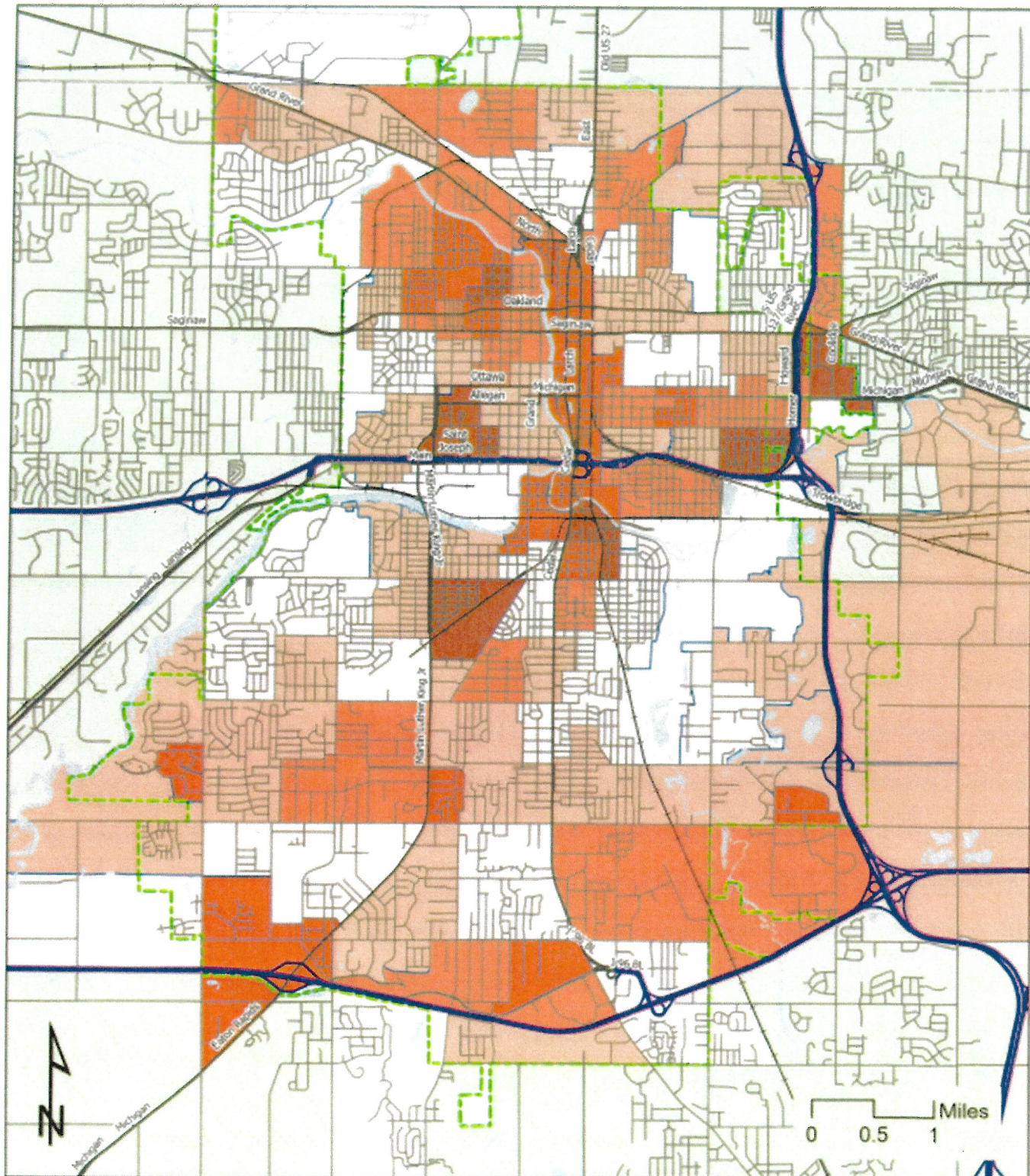
Bed frames
Bicycles
Furniture
Car seats
Fencing and poles (less than 4 feet long, bundled)
Space heaters
Pallets
Lawn mowers (remove gas and oil)
Rugs, rolled up and tied
Sinks
Tires (Must be cut in half/limit 5 per household)
Toilets and plumbing fixtures
Cabinets and countertops (cabinets broken down and counters cut into 4 foot sections)
Light fixtures (remove light bulbs)
Tools (Garden and electrical power)
Exercise equipment
Small Appliances and Electronics (other than computers)
Televisions
Household Paint (In non-liquid form)

Examples of what we cannot accept:

Recyclables, including plastic lawn toys and furniture
Brush, leaves and trimmings (yard waste has separate, no cost pick-up each week via City of Lansing)
Solvents, oil paints or stains, household cleaners/degreasers, flammable liquids, batteries, oils including engine oils or fluids
Medication and Medical Waste
Computers or other electronic equipment that may contain heavy metals (save these items for Recyclerama)
Engines
Water Heaters
Large Household Appliances
Air Conditioners and De-Humidifiers
Batteries (Auto or Motorcycle)
Tanks or Used Oil (Gasoline or Propane)
