#### INFORMATION

At approximately 0135 hours on 10-6-96 I was contacted at my residence and was advised of a serious accident involving an Ingham County Sheriff's Office patrol vehicle. I made contact with the Complaint Desk and was advised by DEPUTY FARMER that he really didn't know what was going on. I advised DEPUTY FARMER that I would be at the Department within approximately 10 minutes.

When I arrived at the Department I met with SGT. SHELTON and DEPUTY BEALS who indicated that one of our patrol vehicles was involved in this accident. DEPUTY BEALS indicated that SGT. PAUL COLE was deceased at this time. I advised SGT. SHELTON that I was going to get my equipment, which I did. I also contacted DR. DAN LEE from Michigan State University, Highway Traffic Safety Center and requested that he come to the accident scene to assist with the investigation.

I went to the scene which was located on Barnes Rd., approximately ½ mile east of Edgar Rd. Upon arrival at the scene, I met with DET. LT. WILCOX who was in charge of the scene. LT. WILCOX indicated that he did not have a lot of information at this time as he had just arrived a short time earlier.

I met with SGT. TIM HOWERY who was off-duty. He indicated that there had been four witnesses to this accident. He stated he had the names of two of the witnesses and BOB HUDSON, who is a part-time officer with the Leslie Police Department had the names of the other two witnesses.

SGT. HOWERY advised me that the four witnesses had indicated that SGT. COLE had been traveling westbound on Barnes Rd. with his emergency equipment activated and he was traveling approximately 90 m.p.h. The witnesses indicated that a herd of deer had run across the roadway and that it appeared that SGT. COLE attempted to avoid these deer and in doing so, lost control of the car and impacted the tree.

### INVESTIGATION

I went up and looked at the vehicle. The vehicle had impacted the tree on the driver's (left) side of the vehicle. The point of impact was just in front of the "B" pillar or approximately where the driver's shoulder would have been sitting in a normal position. The tree intruded into the vehicle approximately 3 ½ feet. The driver, SGT. COLE, was sitting in the passenger seat.

## **INVESTIGATION, Continued**

The glass in the right front window was missing and I was advised that DEPUTY BEALS had broken this window to get to SGT. COLE to assess his condition. All of the other windows in the front and back were in place, however the front windshield was totally shattered, having multiple induced damage cracks in the windshield. The windows on the left side of the vehicle were missing due to the impact of the tree. This glass was laying to the west of the scene across the lawn and out into the roadway. This glass was scattered approximately 150 feet from the point of impact to where the last piece of glass was found.

I started tracing back the skid marks and it would appear that SGT. COLE, was going westbound at the time of the accident and went off the right side of the roadway. It appeared that he corrected to come back onto the road, but over-corrected and the rear end of the vehicle started to come around. The vehicle started to rotate in a counter clock-wise fashion. At this point, SGT. COLE was traveling in a southwesterly direction, going from the north side of the road to the south side of the road and the front end of the vehicle was facing northeast.

At this point SGT. COLE started to leave the roadway. By the evidence in the roadway from the skid marks, the vehicle continued to rotate and was now basically facing northeast. The vehicle continued into a ditch, narrowly missing a tree. It appeared that the front end was slightly airborne for several feet. The front end then came back down and the vehicle impacted the tree.

DR. DAN LEE from Michigan State University arrived at the scene and I advised him of the situation. Myself and DR. LEE then continued looking at the skid marks and looked for any evidence on the patrol vehicle which would indicate why this accident may have occurred.

I then made a field sketch of the scene while DR. LEE looked at the skid marks furthest east of the scene to see if we could get them marked. It was very difficult to observe the skid marks due to the lighting conditions and the light available to us.


After I made the field sketch, myself and DR. LEE measured the entire scene. We marked where the vehicle was, the skid marks coming into the tree, going off from the road, going across the lawn and across the road.

I advised the Rescue Squad members that they could extricate the body from the vehicle, which they did. Personnel from the Mason Area Ambulance Service was standing by, at which time they proceeded to take the body to Sparrow Hospital. DEPUTY BUEHLER of the Ingham County Sheriff's Office escorted the body to Sparrow Hospital. A wrecker from Holt Towing Service had been at the scene and the patrol vehicle was loaded onto a flatbed trailer, towed to the Ingham Opunty Sheriff's Office and placed into Evidence.

### INTERVIEW WITH KEITH SIMONS



At approximately 1815 hours on 10-7-96 I made contact with KEITH SIMONS in reference to this accident. I had received information that he had witnessed the accident and I wanted to get his statement.

KEITH SIMONS indicated that himself and SARAH FAY were southbound on US-127, at which time an Ingham County Sheriff's Office patrol vehicle passed them running lights and siren. He indicated that is the last time he observed them. He indicated in his travels he was southbound on US-127 and was going to go westbound on Barnes Rd.

KEITH SIMONS indicated that he was westbound on Barnes Rd. approaching the intersection of College Rd. and he observed another emergency vehicle. He observe the overhead lights of the vehicle coming southbound on College Rd. and then turn west on Barnes Rd. He indicated at this point he was traveling 55 m.p.h. and this patrol vehicle was steadily pulling

KEITH SIMONS indicated on Barnes Rd. approximately ½ mile west of College Rd., the patrol vehicle which was running emergency went off from the right side of the road. He indicated the patrol vehicle then "shot across to the left side of the road" and at that time he could not see anything else. He indicated that there was dust and at this time himself and another vehicle which was in front of him approached the vehicle which was now resting up against a tree in a yard on Barnes Rd. He indicated that himself and the other people and his girlfriend, SARAH FAY, went up to the car and attempted to open the passenger side door, but that it was jammed shut and that there was nothing that they could do for the victim inside. KEITH SIMONS indicated during this time, the people who lived in the residence came out of the house indicating that they had heard the crash and they immediately went back inside and

KEITH SIMONS did not know the names of the people who were in front of him. He also indicated he did not see any deer. He indicated he talked to the people who were in front of him and they advised him they saw the deer pass in front of the patrol car.

I spoke with SARAH FAY at approximately 1830 hours on 10-10-96.

SARAH FAY indicated she was a passenger in a vehicle with KEITH SIMONS. She stated they were southbound on US-127 and there came a time when she observed an Ingham County Sheriff's Department station wagon go by them traveling southbound on US-127. This vehicle had its lights and siren activated. She indicated this vehicle got off on Barnes Rd., and as far as she could tell, it went westbound on Barnes Rd.

SARAH FAY indicated herself and KEITH SIMONS also went westbound on Barnes Rd. She stated as they were traveling west, they observed a patrol vehicle traveling southbound on College Rd. and then turn westbound onto Barnes Rd. This vehicle had its overhead lights activated. She indicated all of a sudden, it looked like the patrol vehicle was doing a U-turn. She indicated she saw the lights turn around and that is the last thing she could see until they got up to the scene and observed the patrol vehicle sitting against the tree.

SARAH FAY indicated they pulled into the driveway of the house where the patrol vehicle. She indicated there was another vehicle between their vehicle and the patrol vehicle and this vehicle also turned into the driveway. She indicated she did not go up to the car, she stayed back with the vehicles. She indicated that a person came out of the house and called 9-1-1. She stated she basically stood there and waited for emergency personnel to arrive. She stated that is all that she observed in reference to the accident.

He indicated this police car had the overhead lights activated. He stated there was one point which he was less than one-quarter mile behind the police car.

STEVEN TAYLOR indicated he observed something run out in front of the police car. He later indicated that one deer ran out in front of the patrol vehicle. He indicated the next thing he observed was, "I saw the car spin around two or three times". He indicated he was up next to the area and saw that the police car had impacted a tree. He indicated he pulled into the residence where the tree was located and at that time a person came out of the house with a telephone. He stated he advised this person to call 9-1-1.

STEVEN TAYLOR stated he tried several times to open the car doors to get to the person inside the car. He stated a few moments later a Paramedic (later identified as PARAMEDIC DEPUTY ROD BEALS) arrived at the scene. He indicated they again tried to get the door open, at which time DEPUTY BEALS broke the window out of the car, checked the person inside the vehicle and indicated that the subject was deceased.

STEVEN TAYLOR stated he gave his name to an officer at the scene and a few moments later himself and his friend, KATRINA LAWS, left the area and went on their way.

She indicated at this point she was looking down and she thinks she was lighting a cigarette when STEVE TAYLOR stated he saw something jump out. She stated at that time she looked up and saw the car turn around. She stated the next thing she can remember is they were up beside the car and observed that the patrol car was sitting up against a tree.

KATRINA LAWS stated there was moment when she thought the patrol car they observed was coming to help the patrol car that was up against a tree and all of a sudden she realized the car up against the tree was the car that they observed.

She stated she stayed in the car because she had her young son with her and STEVE TAYLOR went up to the car and went up to the patrol car to check the driver. I asked KATRINA LAWS about what had jumped out in front of the patrol vehicle. She indicated she did not see anything at all and that STEVE TAYLOR advised her he observed one deer jump out in front of the patrol car.

The vehicle is self insured through the Michigan Municipal Risk League Pool.

The vehicle was towed to the Ingham County Sheriff's Office and placed into the impound lot.

#### DISPOSITION

Based on the information through my investigation of this accident, it appears that SGT. COLE was traveling westbound on Barnes Rd. SGT. COLE was running emergency to a violent domestic situation to back up a second officer. Due to the witnesses statements, a lone deer passed across the road in front of SGT. COLE, at which time SGT. COLE took evasive maneuvers in an attempt to miss this deer. This does not mean that SGT. COLE may have seen more than one deer.

SGT. COLE's vehicle went off the right side of the roadway. The vehicle started to go into a side-slip in a counter clockwise rotation. At this time the vehicle came back onto the roadway in a side-slip fashion and continued in a southwesterly direction until it went off the road on the south (left) side of the roadway and continued rotating in a counter clockwise fashion. The vehicle went through the ditch on the south (left) side of the roadway until impacting a tree at the driver's door on the left side of the vehicle. The vehicle did a rotation of approximately 260 degrees from the point which it left the roadway until it impacted the tree.

Due to the fact that this was a single motor vehicle accident and the four witnesses indicated there were no other drivers or any other people involved, this case will be closed to this Department at this time.
